The bilingual **Analyst, Teacher Certification Initiatives** supports the Manager, Teacher Certification Initiatives, with the work on the Pan-Canadian Assessment Centre and Integration of Internationally Educated Teachers project, in coordination with the CMEC Registrars for Teacher Certification Canada (RTCC) and its two working groups.

Reporting to the Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials (CICIC) coordinator, the Analyst will support project implementation, especially by undertaking research on the policies and procedures for the assessment and recognition of qualifications related to the teaching profession. The incumbent will collect information, and analyze and prepare research documents used to support decision-making processes by committee and working groups.

This role will appeal to individuals with a strong understanding of academic credentialassessment policies and procedures, as well as rigorous research and data-analysis skills. Applicants should be intellectually curious, possess strong writing skills, and be able to produce complex written documentation for a range of stakeholders. The successful candidate will be tasked with monitoring and investigating emerging developments in teacher certification internationally.
